Of 100 Americans at age 65...

4 of the original 100 people had achieved complete financial independence.

13 had a moderate income and maintained a lifestyle similar to, but less than, what they enjoyed during their working years.

25 were dead. They did not even make it to retirement. That means that, on the average, one out of every four will not live to age 65.

58 were primarily living on Social Security and some small pension. Of these, over 60% were at or below the poverty level.
